

## **.43 WARNINGS**

**A. When an investigation of a complaint or an inspection of a family day care home indicates a violation of these regulations that does not present an immediate threat to the health, safety, and welfare of a child in care, the Office shall issue a warning in writing, on an inspection report or by separate letter, that states:**

- (1) The violation found, citing the regulation;**
- (2) The time period for correcting the violation; and**
- (3) That failure to correct the violation may result in sanctions being imposed or in suspension or revocation of the registration.**

INTENT: A warning serves notice that you have failed to comply with one or more child care regulations and that corrective action must be taken within a certain amount of time. Failure to make the correction may result in some enforcement action against the registration.

**B. If the Office determines that the violation has not been corrected within the time period allowed, the Office may follow the requirements of Regulations .44 - .46 of this chapter to impose sanctions or to suspend or revoke the registration.**

INTENT: When a regulatory violation is not corrected following a warning, the Office may take an action against the registration.

General Note:

Following a home inspection where a violation is found, documentation of the violation is left with you. This documentation specifies the violation and a plan for correction, including a time frame for correction. This is a notice to you that the violation(s) must be corrected within the specified time-frame(s), or more serious enforcement action may be necessary if compliance is not achieved.
