Hours of instruction	Flexible. Enough to provide regular, thorough instruction in the studies usually taught in the public schools to children of the same age	The length of instruction for students in a full-day program is a minimum of 6 hours a week. The length of instruction for students in half-day programs is a minimum of 3 hours a week.
Verification	Unified form submitted 15 days prior to beginning home instruction Annual verification of continuation portfolio review or non-public reviews Change of Status	verification of the physical condition, including drug and alcohol dependency, by a licensed physician or certified nurse practitioner, verification of emotional condition by a certified school psychologist, licensed psychologist, licensed psychiatrist.

Home Instruction details

- Upon application of a child for admission to a public school from a home instruction program, the local superintendent shall determine by an evaluation the placement of the child and any credits to be awarded toward high school graduation. The evaluation may include administration of standardized tests and examinations and interviews with the child.
- It is at the discretion of future employers and institutes of higher education to accept home instruction forms that are produced from families and/or partnering entities that signify program completion. Many do.
