What is House Bill 1402

- Public School Opportunities Enhancement Act that establishes Public School Opportunities Enhancement Program and Grant in the Maryland State Department of Education (MSDE)
- Purpose of Grant Funds
 - Extended day and summer enhancement programs
 - Summer enhancement programs
 - Establish new educational or recreational partnerships with specified entities

House Bill 1402

Proposed activities must target specific local education agencies, nonprofit [501(c)(3)] organizations, and Community Schools (currently in Baltimore City and Prince George's County). Each local school system must have at least 50 percent of public school students that qualify for free lunch under the National School Lunch Program.

House Bill 1402

A nonprofit organization may apply for a grant to support existing educational programming during the school day, including the recruitment, training, and ongoing professional development of new teachers.

Priorities

Extended Day

- Integrate an educational component that assist students in meeting academic requirements on grade level

School Day

- Enhance education purpose of school
- Enhance students' access to physical, social, and emotional support

Summer

- Provide learning and enrichment activities that will assist students in achieving at or about grade level in the next school year
- Expose students to future learning and life opportunities

21st Century Community Learning Centers (CCLC)



What is 21st CCLC

- A federal grant administered by the MSDE to create community learning centers that provide students with academic enrichment opportunities as well as additional services designed to complement their regular academic program. Community learning centers must also offer families of participating students literacy instruction and related educational development.

21st CCLC

- Proposed activities must target students and families of students who attend Title I school-wide programs or schools that serve a high percentage (40% or above) of students from low-income families.
- Receive approximately 15 million per year
- Currently 90 grantees
- Serving over 12,000 students in about 179 sites
- In 19 of 24 jurisdictions in MD

Who is Eligible to Apply

This competition is open to Maryland local education agencies, interagency, interdepartmental, community and faith-based or other private or public organizations, or a consortium of two or more of the aforementioned.

Priorities

Absolute Priorities are those priorities which must be addressed by all proposals; failure to do so will disqualify a proposal from consideration

Competitive Priorities are optional and, if addressed, may earn additional points

Absolute Priorities

- ❑ Targeted students
- ❑ Partnerships of eligible entities
- ❑ Integrate character education
- ❑ Integrate service-learning

Competitive Priorities

- ❑ College and Career Readiness
- ❑ Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM)
- ❑ High Quality Arts Programming
- ❑ Positive physical, emotional and social development
- ❑ ETC.

21st CCLC and HB 1402

21st CCLC

- Funds programs that occur before school, after school, during the summer, and on Saturdays
- Must have quality academic component
- Must have quality enrichment component

HB 1402

- Funds programs that occur before school, after school, weekends, holidays, during vacation and summer breaks
- Must have quality academic component
- Must have quality enrichment component

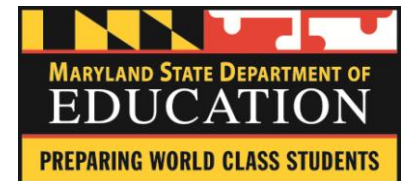
21st CCLC and HB 1402

21st CCLC Eligible Entities

- Maryland local education agencies and schools
- Interagency, interdepartmental, community and faith-based or other private or public organizations
- Must **target** students and families of students who attend Title I school-wide programs or schools that serve a high percentage (40% or above) Free and Reduced Meals

HB 1402 Eligible Entities

- Local Education Agencies(LEA)
- Community Schools
- Nonprofit Organizations
- Counties including Baltimore City and the Seed School with at least 50% of public school students that qualify for free lunch under the National School Lunch Program.



21st CCLC and HB 1402

21st CCLC

- \$50,000 minimum
- \$400,000 maximum
- Three years

HB 1402

- \$50,000 minimum
- \$250,000 maximum
- Four years
