Summary of Discussion

The November meeting focused on review and edit of the Council Annual Report. The following edits were recommended by the meeting participants:

Overview of SBHC Landscape

- Appendix 1 -- show by county how many SBHCs are in each jurisdiction; show the enrollment of the schools and enrollment the county; split the chart into two (one demographic and one utilization)
- Appendix 2 – Clarify the number of SBHCs directly supported by MSDE versus other sources; present the dollars being covered by locals; explanation of the unallocated funds; identify sources of funding from other sources
- Include the average cost of running a SBHC to provide more context for the funding; explanation of what the funding is buying; present a range; look at the SBHA national language; review applications to place into the narrative; MHRC – sending additional data about the funding of SBHC; also, helpful to calculate per pupil costs

Structure and Priorities

- Council Structure. Quarterly meetings will be face to face. Clarified how the work group and Vice Chairs will be appointed.
- Priorities
- Question 3: Puts the onus of SBHCs; this question should reflect the need for a statewide vision and supports for SBHC; What is the statewide vision for SBHC? What can be done at the statewide level to support system integration and SBHC sustainability?
- Where would the work related to the application process and development of SBHC take place? Link it to the System Integration and Funding Work Group
- Coordination -- include new requirements for immunizations, chronic care management, allergies, etc.
