

## Holistic Rubric for Grade 3: Narrative Writing

This holistic rubric guides the evaluation of a student response by providing descriptions of sample characteristics for each score point. ELA/L responses are scored for both written expression and written conventions. A score is based on an overall analysis of what is included in a student's response rather than what is missing. It is not necessary for a response to include all the sample characteristics.

## WRITTEN EXPRESSION

Points	Sample Characteristics
3 Points	<ul> <li>Develops experiences or events using effective techniques, well-chosen details, and well-structured event sequences.</li> </ul>
	Develops clear and coherent writing in which the development,     organization, and style are appropriate to task, purpose, and audience.
	Uses narrative techniques to effectively develop an event sequence.
	<ul> <li>Includes an effective topical link to the sources which enhances the narrative.</li> </ul>
	Uses effective words and phrases to signal order.
2 Points	<ul> <li>Develops experiences or events using mostly effective techniques, details, and structured event sequences.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Develops mostly clear and coherent writing in which the development, organization, and style are appropriate to task, purpose, and audience.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Uses adequate narrative techniques to develop a mostly effective narrative sequence.</li> </ul>
	Includes a topical link to the sources which supports the narrative.
	Uses words and phrases to signal event order.
1 Point	<ul> <li>Demonstrates limited experiences or events using minimally effective techniques, details, and event sequences.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Develops minimally coherent writing in which the development, organization, and style for the task, purpose, and audience are limited.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Uses minimal narrative techniques and is limited in its development of events.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Includes a topical link to the sources which is limited in its appropriateness.</li> </ul>
	Uses minimal language to signal event order.

Points	Sample Characteristics
0 Point	<ul> <li>Uses undeveloped experiences or events with missing or inaccurate techniques, details, and events.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Lacks coherent writing, organization, and style for the task, purpose, and audience.</li> </ul>
	Is undeveloped and/or inappropriate; it is missing narrative elements and a sequence of events.
	<ul> <li>Does not include a topical link to the sources or one is inappropriate or inaccurate.</li> </ul>
	Lacks language to signal event order.

## WRITTEN CONVENTIONS

Points	Sample Characteristics
3 Points	The response demonstrates a full command of conventions of standard English at the appropriate level of complexity.
	Sentence structures are varied, well-formed, and effectively controlled.
	<ul> <li>Grammar and usage are strong and effective, enhancing the content of the response.</li> </ul>
	Spelling, punctuation, and capitalization are mostly correct.
2 Points	The response demonstrates a partial command of conventions of standard English at the appropriate level of complexity.
	Sentence structures show some variety and are generally controlled.
	Grammar and usage may be uneven and may occasionally impede understanding.
	Spelling, punctuation, and capitalization are generally correct.
1 Point	The response demonstrates little command of conventions of standard English at the appropriate level of complexity.
	Sentence structure and control are limited.
	<ul> <li>Errors in grammar and usage may be frequent and may impede understanding.</li> </ul>
	Spelling, punctuation, and capitalization may be incorrect and/or unclear.
0 Point	The response does not demonstrate command of the conventions of standard English at the appropriate level of complexity.
	<ul> <li>Frequent and varied errors in mechanics, grammar, and usage severely impede understanding.</li> </ul>
