Dear Mr. Smarick and Dr. Salmon:

The Legislative Policy Committee has received the Draft Consolidated State Plan required by the federal Every Student Succeeds Act in accordance with Chapter 630 of 2014. We appreciate the opportunity to review and comment on the plan.

We have identified several issues in the draft plan that we believe merit further attention, including: (1) a lack of specificity in some elements of the plan; (2) the identification of schools in need of comprehensive (CSI) and targeted support and improvement (TSI); (3) the distribution of funds for CSI and TSI; (4) requiring specific local intervention; and (5) the lack of a methodology for comparing schools with similar demographic characteristics. Please see the enclosed legislative analysis written by the Department of Legislative Services for more detail.

Further, enclosed please find advice from the Office of the Attorney General regarding whether the identification of the lowest-performing schools must include both academic and school quality indicators, in compliance with Chapter 29 of 2017 (Protect Our Schools Act). In light of the conclusion of the Office of the Attorney General that "the better reading...[of the law] is that the State Board must consider both types of factors" and with an understanding that the General Assembly passed legislation with the intention for all indicators to be used in the identification of all CSI and TSI schools, we are confident that the State board will make the necessary adjustments to the plan.

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We urge the State board to address these concerns in the final plan that is submitted to the U.S. Department of Education.
