To Local Chief Financial Officers:

Attached is a Preliminary DRAFT of documents related to the calculation of State Aid and Maintenance of Effort (MOE) for FY 2020. As usual, the State Aid estimates themselves are not yet available. The data being provided to you in the attached document is as follows:

- The first three pages reflect a preliminary schedule of the enrollment counts we have received from your school system and from SEED School of Maryland. If you believe that there are any inaccuracies, please notify me by **no later than 3pm on Thursday, December 27th**;
- For school systems participating in the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) Community Eligibility Provision (CEP), we are sending you a separate schedule with the specific calculations of the counts to be used for the Compensatory Education Formula;
- Also attached is a summary of preliminary wealth data. Note that this data includes some material changes, for which we have requested explanations from the respective State agencies, and that may change prior to calculation of State Aid;
- The last page of the document reflects a preliminary calculation of Education Effort for use in the State's Maintenance of Effort calculations. This schedule identifies those counties that fall below the five-year statewide average education effort. It also shows a very preliminary estimate of the changes in wealth per pupil. The preliminary estimated change in statewide wealth per pupil exceeds 2.5%, therefore, counties not meeting the five-year statewide average would be required to increase their per pupil MOE by the lesser of the county's increase in local wealth per pupil or 2.5%. The estimated required increases are shown in the far right hand column of the schedule. Education Effort is calculated by dividing the local appropriation by the respective local wealth using November Net Taxable Income data.

It is very important to remember that these figures are not final and are subject to change.
