## Title IV, Part A: Scoring Rubric

**DESCRIPTION:** The purpose of the Title IV, Part A Scoring Rubric is to provide LEAs with a transparent overview of the SSAE application scoring system. There are a series of components for each required section of the application. LEAs will receive a performance mark indicating if the component Exceeds the Requirement, Meets the Requirement, or Does Not Meet the Requirement. Specific feedback will be provided for each component that Does Not Meet the Requirement indicating the necessary adjustments to Meet or Exceed each requirement. Each application component must Meet or Exceed the requirement for approval. Subsequent application submissions are permitted for LEAs to obtain approval and technical assistance will be available throughout the application cycle. Please refer to the Grant Information Guide for Title IV, Part A requirements and additional background information pertaining to each component of the application.
