Welcome, approve minutes, and warm up activity

Dr. Williamson greeted the task force and officially started the meeting at 9:00 AM. The task force voted and approved the minutes with no opposition.

Next, Dr. Williamson presented the day's agenda and explained the opening activity. In small groups, the task force was directed to reflect upon and discuss what they believed to be the most important aspect of the task force's work. Generated feedback included themes of equity, the significance of a Maryland diploma to employers and institutions of higher education, universality of requirements, flexible options, and alternative assessments.

Review readings on current regulations

Dr. Williamson led a brief discussion and answered questions about the assigned readings and reviewed the current regulations set forth in the Code of Maryland Regulations (COMAR) pertaining to the high school graduation requirements.

Refine preliminary goals/guiding themes and begin interpreting them as committee work

Dr. Shaw explained to the task force that they would now be refining the broader goals and concepts they constructed last week. Dr. Shaw led an activity the task force would be utilizing in their committee work. Using the three guiding concepts developed by the task force at the previous meeting (knowledge and skills, personalization, and equity), the task force was asked to develop lists of guiding questions and researchable sources of information they would need to make future recommendations.

Present committee assignments

Dr. Williamson explained the process by which committee members were selected and arranged into the three committees: program, assessments, and diplomas. Dr. Shaw and Dr. Williamson then displayed the committee membership, introduced the committees to their Maryland State Department of Education (MSDE) support staff, and explained where the committee members would be transitioning to for their committee work after the break. The task force took a brief fifteen minute break before resuming work in their committees.

Committee work: finish interpretation of goals/themes, begin to brainstorm need-to-knows

The task force then separated into their committees to discuss the guiding concepts of equity, personalization, and knowledge and skills under the purview of their committee assignments, e.g. credits, assessments, and diplomas. Committee facilitators will consolidate the guiding questions (which will be used to form recommendations) and need-to-know items (which will become the rationale for the recommendations).

Wrap up and next steps

Dr. Shaw reconvened the task force from their committee work and reminded the group to check their committee folders online in order to access new reference and resource material for future meetings.

Dr. Shaw and Dr. Williamson shared closing remarks and thanks. They explained that the majority of time at the next meeting would be spent on committee work.
