

## Maryland State School Health Council Online Meeting: 2019 Legislative Wrap-up

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## Education- Personnel Matters-Child Sexual Abuse and Sexual Misconduct Prevention (HB486)

 Requires county boards of education, nonpublic schools, and contracting agencies to *require* an applicant for a position *involving direct contact with minors* to submit information from previous employers on whether they had *previously* been investigated for child abuse.

# Environment - Drinking Water Outlets in School Buildings - Elevated Level of Lead and Grant Program (HB1253/SB481)

- Alters the definition of "elevated level of lead" to mean a lead concentration in drinking water exceeding 5 parts per billion for provisions of law relating to testing for the presence of lead in drinking water outlets in school buildings;
- Requires the *Department of the Environment*, in consultation with the *State Department of Education*, to establish and administer a *grant program* to assist local school systems with costs associated with implementing remedial measures.

## Elementary School Students: Daily Physical Activity (Student Health and Fitness Act) (HB110)

- Requires daily physical activity be provided in public elementary schools;
- The bill originally stated that the physical education must total
   150 minutes each week and include a minimum of 90 minutes
   of physical education.
- The bill did not ultimately pass.

# Public Schools- Provision of Feminine Hygiene Products (HB133)

 The bill requires a county board of education to ensure that each public school serving students in any grade from grades 6 through 12 provides, at no charge to students, feminine hygiene products in the restrooms at the school.

#### Prince George's County- Elementary School Students- Daily Physical Activity (Student Health and Fitness Act) (HB196)

- Requires public school students in Prince George's County
  elementary schools to be provided a daily program of physical
  activity, totaling 150 minutes weekly;
- Requires that student's physical activity program to be consistent with the student's Individualized Education Program, if applicable.

## Public School Students - Vision Services and the Vision for Maryland Program (HB1242/SB915)

- Requires each county board of education to coordinate with the Vision for Maryland Program to ensure that students are able to receive eye examinations and, if necessary, eyeglasses;
- Establishes the Vision for Maryland Program;
- Requires the Maryland Department of Health to carry out the Program in consultation with Johns Hopkins University, county boards of education, and local health departments.

# State Department of Education-Guidelines on Trauma Informed Approach (SB223/HB256)

 Establishes a Trauma-Informed School Initiative which would include providing trainings to staff members of local school systems and establish guidelines for how schools approach student's trauma.
