SHOW ME LAW!

An LEA shall demonstrate that the *methodology* used to allocate State and local funds to each school receiving assistance under this part ensures that such school receives *all of the State and local funds* it would otherwise receive it if were not receiving assistance under this part. *1118(b)(2)*





RULES OF SUPPLEMENT NOT SUPPLANT

- Title I, Part A funds should *add* to (supplement) and not *replace* (supplant) state and local funds.
- Title One rules still apply! (Ask: Allowable, Reasonable, Necessary)
- Keep it Title I Neutral
- SNS is one three fiscal tests for Title I



NOW, BREAK IT DOWN LIKE A FRACTION.

IN OTHER WORDS:

- **1. SNS**...REMEMBER TITLE I FUNDS ADD TO THE FUNDING POT
- 2. **TITLE I NEUTRAL**...DON'T FACTOR IN MY TITLE I FUNDING WHEN ALLOCATING FUNDING
- 3. **METHODOLOGY** = METHOD FOR DISTRIBUTION OF FUNDS



NOT TODAY...



No LEA shall be required to:

- Identify that an individual cost or service supported with Title I funds is supplemental;
 or
- Provide Title I services through a particular instructional method or in a particular instructional setting in order to demonstrate compliance.

(ESEA section 1118(b)(3))



Exclusion of Funds

SEA or LEA may exclude supplemental state or local funds used for program that meet the *intents and purposes* of Title I Part A (Sec. 1118(d)).

- Excluded from SNS Methodology Test:
 - Single School LEAs;
 - A grade span with a single school (i.e., no methodology is required for the single school grade span); or
 - LEAs with only Title I schools.



Exclusion of Funds

- Excluded from SNS Methodology Test:
 - Single School LEAs;
 - A grade span with a single school (i.e., no methodology is required for the sin school grade span); or
 - LEAs with only Title I schools

An LEA shall demonstrate that the *methodology* used to allocate State and local funds to each school receiving assistance under this part ensures that such school receives *all of the State and local funds* it would otherwise receive it if were not receiving assistance under this part. *1118(b)(2)*



THINGS TO CONSIDER

- 1. When budget processing, how much is available for school operation in our systems?
- 2. How many school do we have? Are all schools included in this plan?
- 3. Do all schools in this plan require the same funding?
- 4. Are all of my State/Local funds equitably distributed across school that are Title I and non Title I?



WHAT'S INCLUDED IN MY LSSs METHODOLOGY?

- 1. Statement of Methodology (narrative explaining the methodology)
- 2. Type(s) of Methodology
- 3. Mathematical Calculation Formula

Does MSDE have a standard format or template that I can use?



TYPES OF METHODOLOGY

- 1. Funding Formula Weighted PPA
- 2. Funding Formula based on staffing & supplies
- **3. Funding Formula based on a combination** approach (weighted PPA & staffing & supplies)
- 4. Funding Formula based on a locally developed methodology approved by the SEA

DOES THE **STATE HAVE TO APPROVE** MY METHODOLOGY?





CAN THE STATE GO ABOVE & BEYOND STATUTE TO ENSURE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE LAW? CAN THEY DO THAT!!!!????



The statute of limitations for recovery of an unallowable cost is:

REMEMBER

The ESEA requires an LEA to use Title I, Part A funds only for allowable costs; so, an LEA's use of Title I, Part A funds might not violate the supplement not supplant requirement but it might not be an allowable use of those funds.
