Meeting Minutes

March 7, 2024

The 489th meeting of the Professional Standards and Teacher Education Board (PSTEB) was held virtually on March 8, 2024. Ms. Maleeta Kitchen called the meeting to order at 9:35 a.m.

Public Comment

Dr. Stacy Brown-Hobbs provided public comments regarding performance-based licensure assessments.

Dr. Barbara Marinak provided public comments regarding performance-based licensure assessments.

State Board of Education Update

Mr. Zachary Hands shared a summary of the February State Board of Education meeting, sharing that the State Board hosted a joint meeting with the Accountability and Implementation Board (AIB) for the first half of the day to discuss Career and College Ready pathways.

Mr. Hands indicated that the Board voted to adopt revised Early Learning Standards, the regenerated Praxis subject assessment for special education, and a pre-k sliding scale as required in the Blueprint for Maryland's Future.

Mr. Hands stated that the Board voted to oppose a number of curricular mandate bills along with a few other bills that were introduced this legislative session.

Ms. Meadows provided further information regarding the adoption of the regenerated Praxis special education assessment adopted by the Board.

Dr. Bulson stated that Harford County is building a model school (Roy Williams Elementary School) where they have a cohort of aspiring teachers from Towson University, who are helping rework the model for teacher preparation.

Ms. Bobbitt accounted that Booker T. Washington Middle School, a school that had a negative reputation over the years, is now home to the 2023-2024 Baltimore City Teacher of the Year and the Heart of the School Principal.
