Dear Parties:

The Maryland State Department of Education (MSDE), Division of Special Education/Early Intervention Services (DSE/EIS), has completed the investigation of the complaint regarding special education services for the above-referenced student. This correspondence is the report of the final results of the investigation.

ALLEGATIONS:

On August 2, 2018, the MSDE received a complaint from Ms. XXXXXXXXX, hereafter "the complainant," on behalf of the above-referenced student. In that correspondence, the complainant alleged that the Prince George's County Public Schools (PGCPS) violated certain provisions of the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) with respect to the student.

The MSDE investigated the allegation that the PGCPS has not ensured that the student has been provided with a reading intervention program required by the Individualized Education Program (IEP) since the start of the 2017 - 2018 school year, in accordance with 34 CFR §§300.101 and .323.

BACKGROUND:

The student is fifteen (15) years old and is identified as a student with a Specific Learning Disability under the IDEA, which impacts his reading comprehension skills. The student

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attended XXXXXXXXXXX during the 2017 - 2018 school year¹ and has an IEP that requires the provision of special education and related services.

FINDINGS OF FACTS:

- 1. The IEP requires that the student be provided with specialized instruction using a research-based reading intervention.
- 2. On March 14, 2018, the IEP team convened to address the complainant's concern that the student was not being provided with the reading intervention required by the IEP. The IEP team agreed that the student "should have participated in a reading intervention program [and] as a result comp[ensatory] services will be provided." The Prior Written Notice from the March 14, 2018 IEP meeting documents the IEP team's decision that the compensatory services would be provided to the student during Summer 2018.
- 3. On March 15, 2018, the school system staff documented that the student would be provided with compensatory services during July 2018 and August 2018.
- 4. There is no documentation that compensatory services have been provided to the student.

CONCLUSION:

Based on the above Findings of Facts, the MSDE finds that the student was not provided with instruction using a research-based reading intervention as required by the IEP, in accordance with 34 CFR 300.101 and .323. Therefore, this office finds that a violation occurred.

Student-Specific

The MSDE requires the following:

- 1. At the end of the first (1st) quarter of the 2018 2019 school year during which the student's IEP requires reading intervention, the PGCPS must provide documentation that the student is consistently being provided with the intervention. The PGCPS must also provide the same documentation at the end of each subsequent quarter of the 2018 2019 school year, provided the IEP continues to require reading intervention.
- 2. The PGCPS must provide documentation, by October 1, 2018, of the offer of compensatory services, including any necessary transportation services for the student to access the compensatory services, for the violation identified in this Letter of Findings.

¹ The student will attend XXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXX for the 2018 - 2019 school year.

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The documentation must include a description of the amount and nature of compensatory services, and identify a schedule for the delivery of the services as well as the date by which the delivery of these services must be completed. Within one (1) year of the date of this Letter of Findings, the PGCPS must provide documentation that the student has been provided with the compensatory services, as offered or documentation of the complainant's refusal of such compensatory services.

The PGCPS must provide the MSDE with documentation of each corrective action within thirty (30) days of its completion.

School-Based

The MSDE requires the PGCPS to provide documentation by October 1, 2018, of the steps it has taken, including training, to ensure that the XXXXXXXXXXX staff comply with the IDEA and related State requirements for ensuring implementation of the IEP. The documentation must include a description of how the school system will evaluate the effectiveness of the steps taken and monitor to ensure that the violation does not recur.

Documentation of all corrective action taken is to be submitted to this office to: Attention: Chief, Family Support and Dispute Resolution Branch, Division of Special Education/Early Intervention Services, MSDE.

As of the date of this correspondence, this Letter of Findings is considered final. This office will not reconsider the conclusions reached in this Letter of Findings unless new, previously unavailable documentation is submitted and received by this office within fifteen (15) days of the date of this correspondence. The new documentation must support a written request for reconsideration, and the written request must include a compelling reason for why the documentation was not made available during the investigation. Pending this office's decision on a request for reconsideration, the public agency must implement any corrective actions within the timelines reported in this Letter of Findings.

Questions regarding the findings and conclusions contained in this letter should be addressed to this office in writing. The complainant maintains the right to request mediation or to file a due process complaint, if they disagree with the identification, evaluation, placement, or provision of a Free Appropriate Public Education for the student, including issues subject to this State

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complaint investigation, consistent with the IDEA. The MSDE recommends that this Letter of Findings be included with any request for mediation or a due process complaint.
