 - b. Data disaggregated by student group

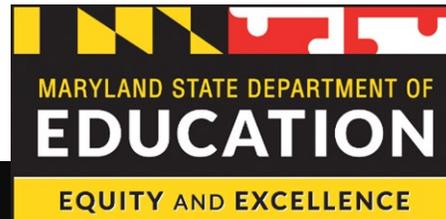

Advanced Placement (AP) Data Sources

- College Board released the “AP Cohort Data Report: Graduating Class of 2020” on February 24, 2021.
 - College Board data represents the “Class of 2020,” as reported by the student to College Board.
 - Students in the Class of 2020 may have taken an AP exam at any point in high school prior to their anticipated graduation date.
 - In some cases, College Board counts are combined with MDSE data to increase accuracy. All data sources are noted.
- AP and SAT data is available on MDReportCard.org
 - Administrative data includes all exams taken in a given year, regardless of the grade level of the student.

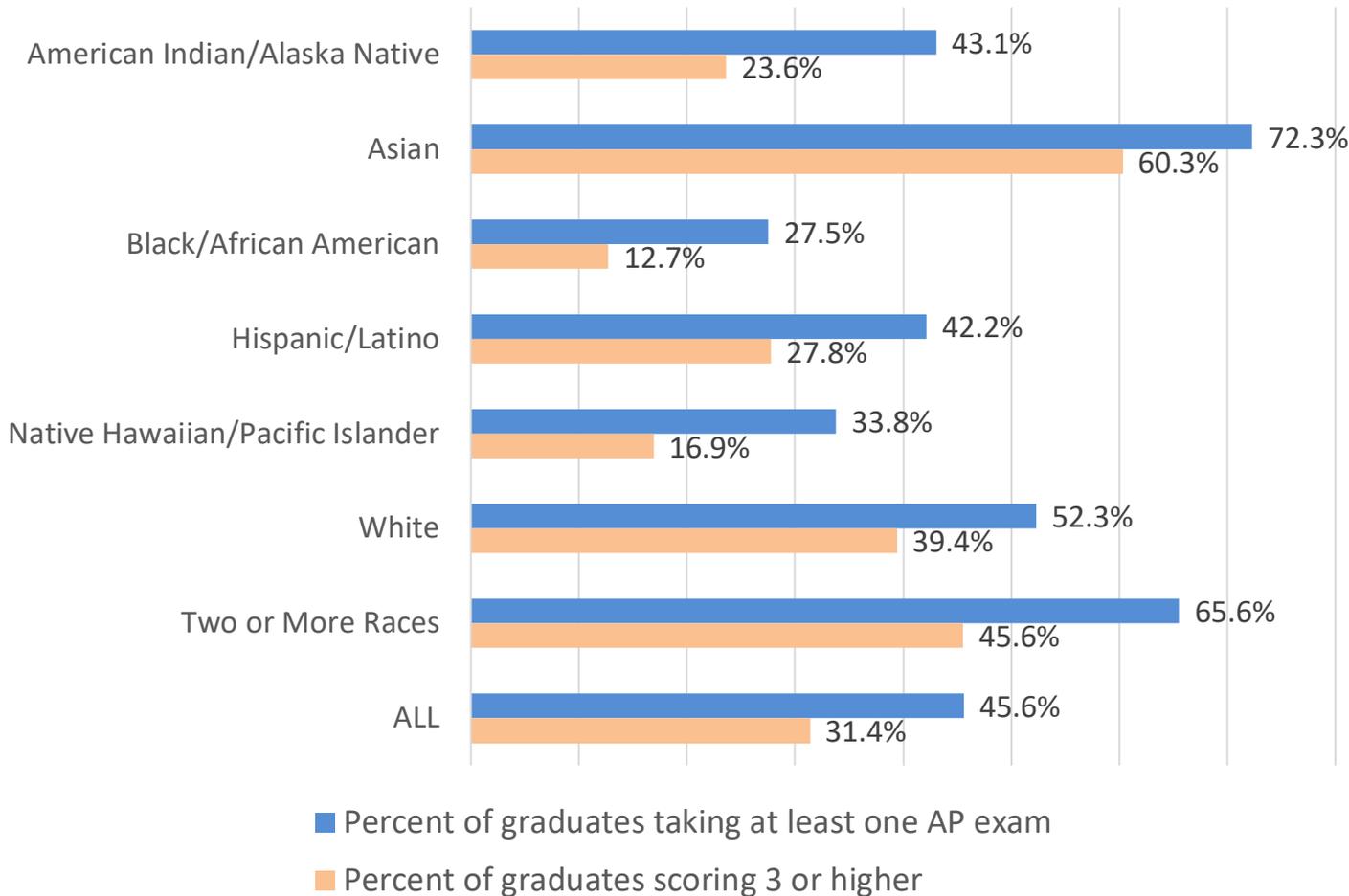

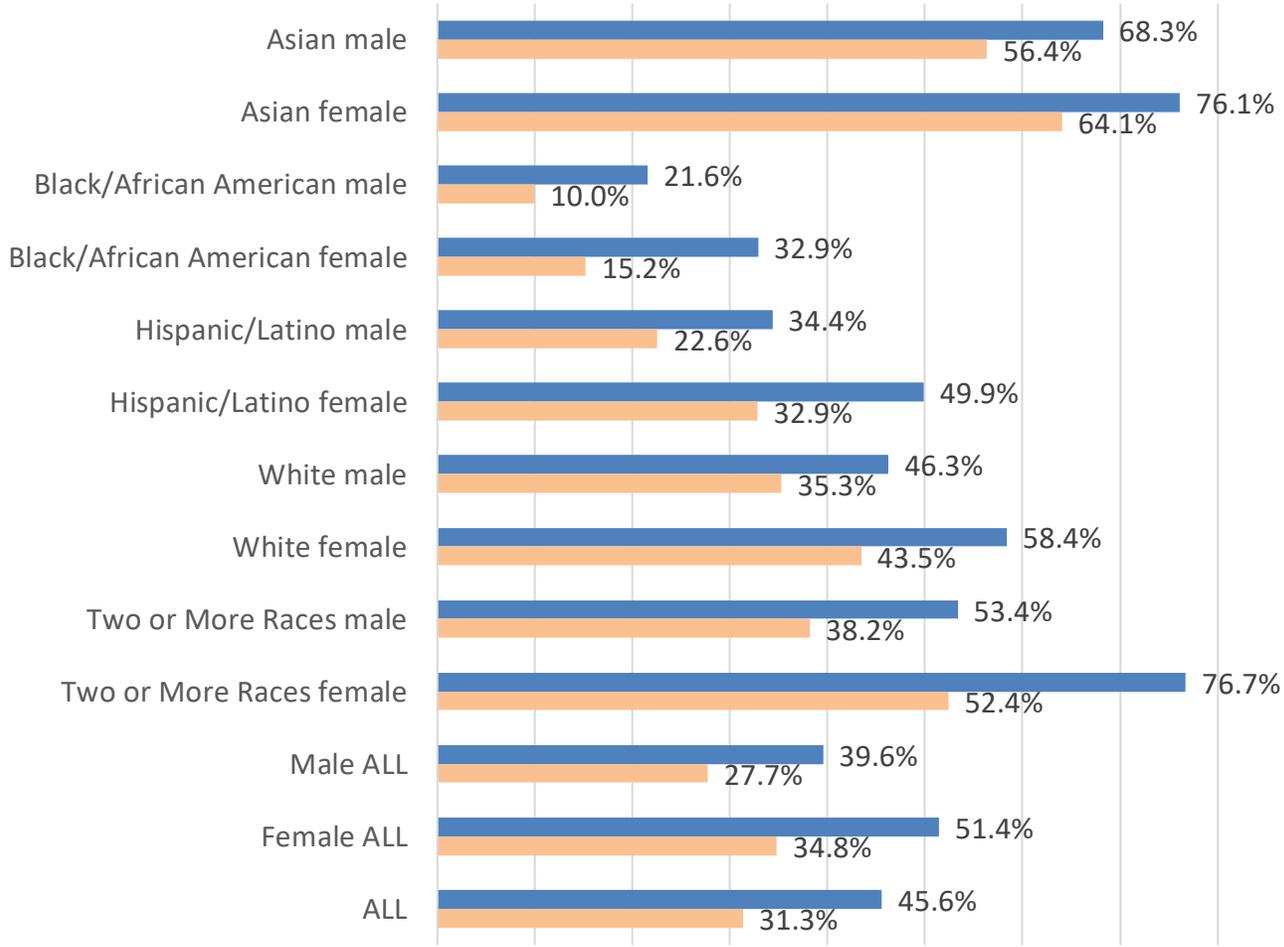

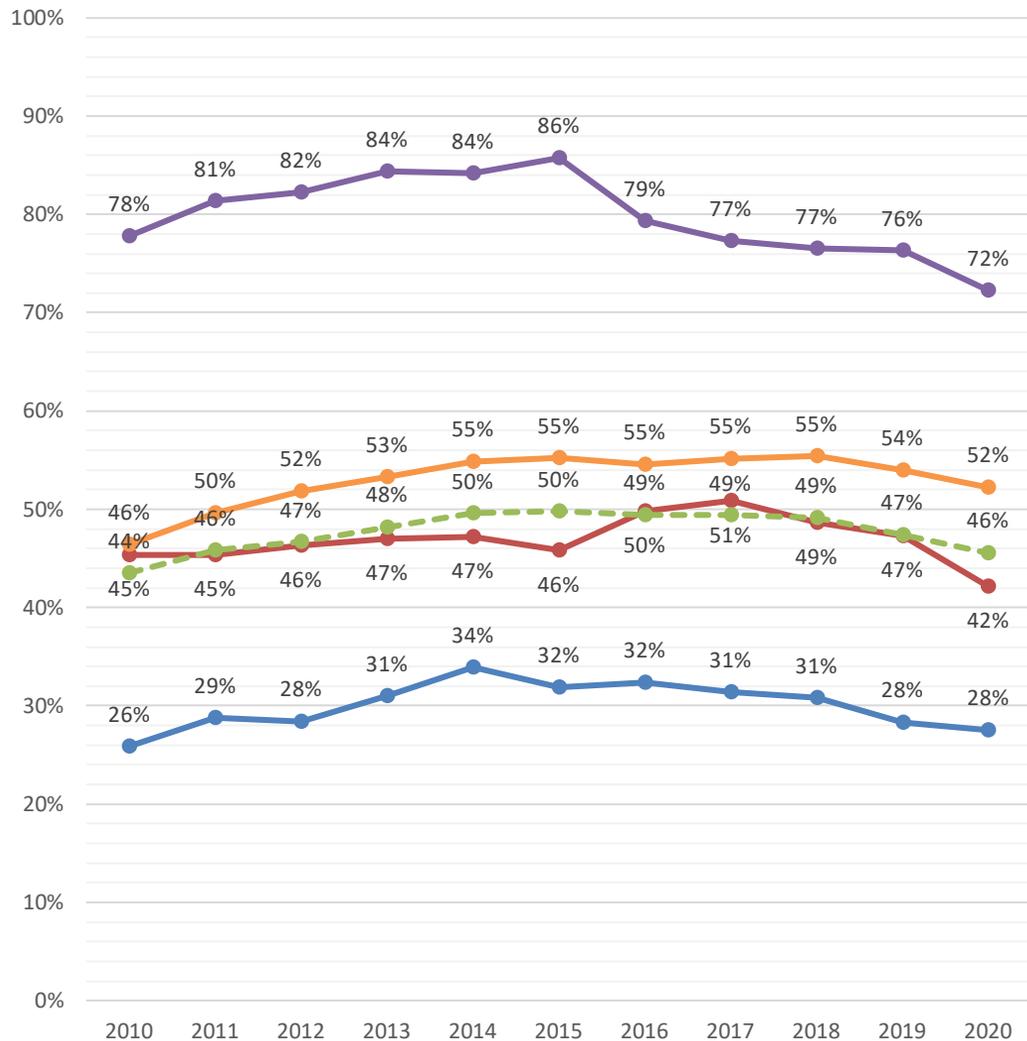

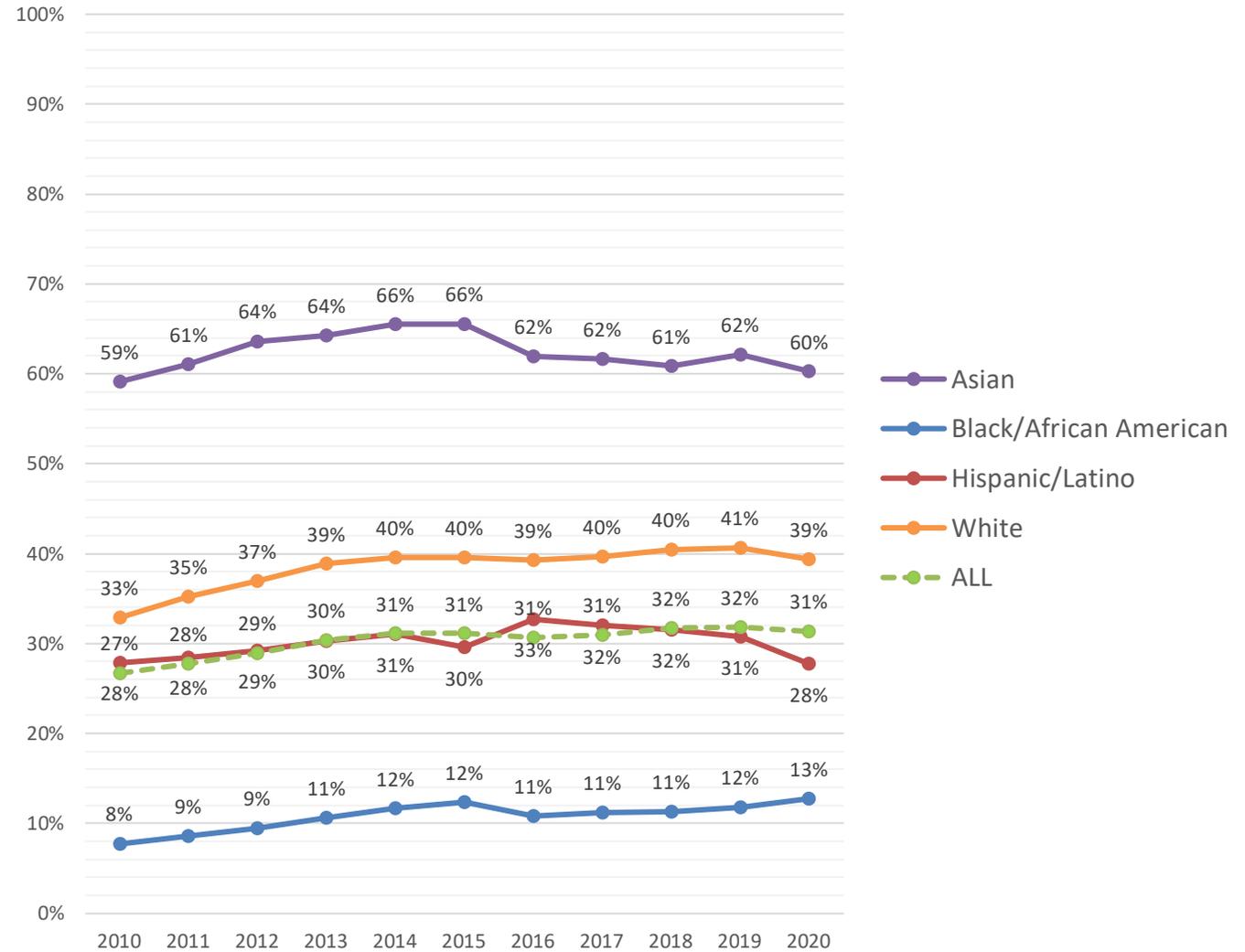

Percent of Graduates Taking at Least One AP in HS



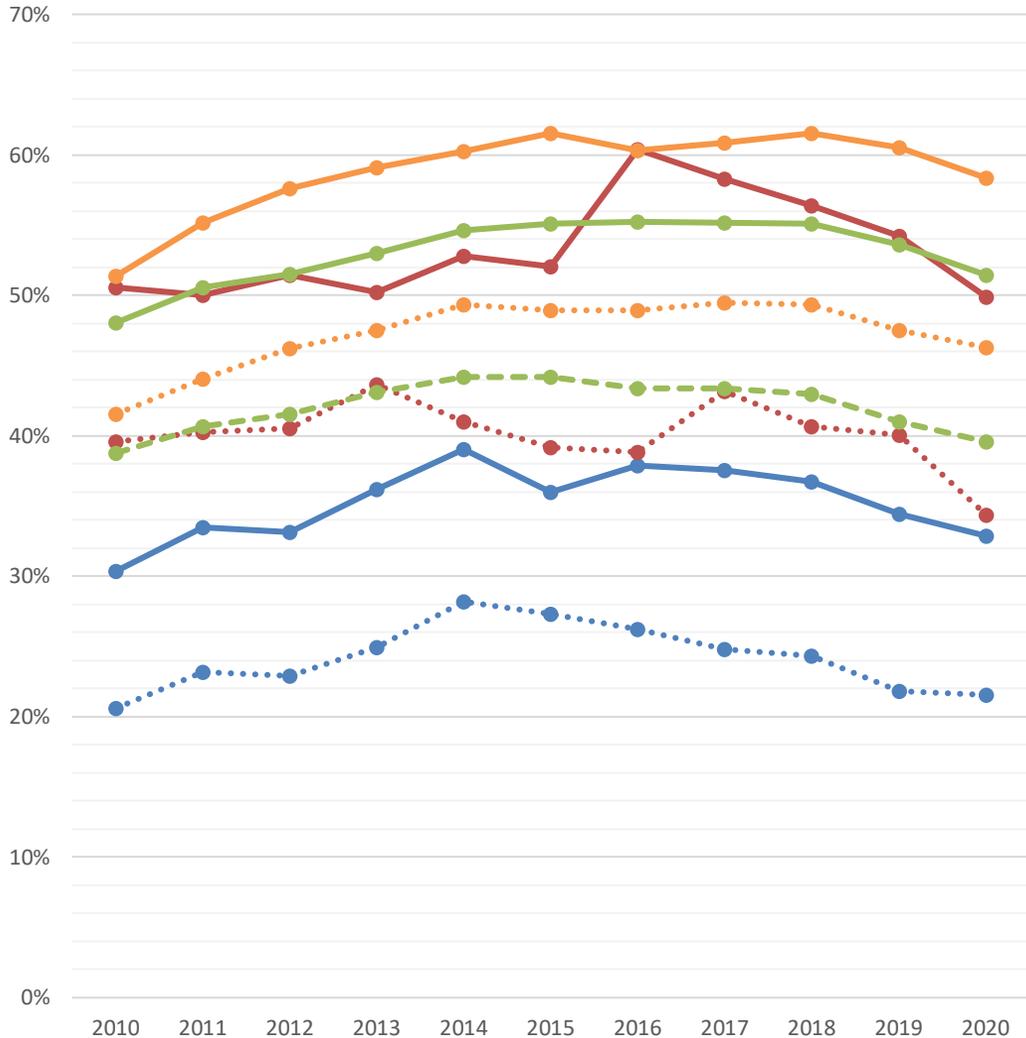
Percent of Graduates Passing at Least One AP Exam in HS



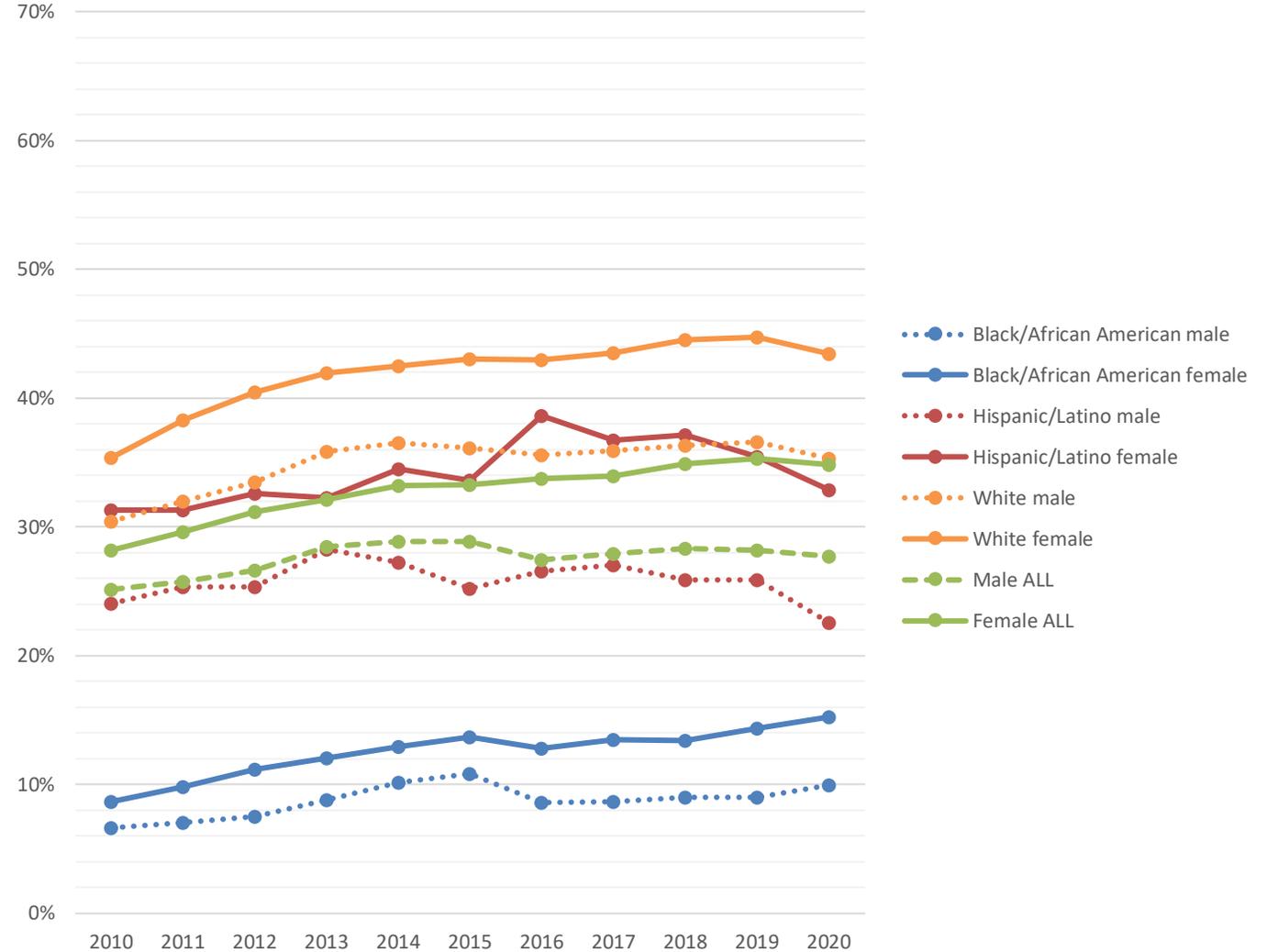
