

Profile of Salem Avenue Elementary School (Pre-K to 5) in Washington County

Demographics and Student Achievement

On average, schools with higher proportions of economically disadvantaged students have lower achievement.




In general, a 10-percentage point increase in economically disadvantaged students in a school is associated with an approximately a 7-percentage point decrease in ELA or math achievement.

Salem Avenue Elementary outperformed what the data predicts for the average school with a similar proportion of Economically Disadvantaged students.




Salem Avenue Enrollment by Student Demographics

Nearly three quarters of Salem Avenue Elementary's students are economically disadvantaged and their enrollment is racially/ethnically diverse.*



Enrollment by Race/Ethnicity, 2021-2022




Enrollment by Student Group, 2021-2022

Tiers indicate the relative level of poverty in a neighborhood.

* Block groups are the smallest geographical units for which the Census reports data publicly. Maryland has an additional 44 block groups that do not have data on the four measures, primarily because they are not residential areas.


Students within each Neighborhood Tier

Over half of students in Washington County live in Tier 4 or 5 neighborhoods.

Statewide, 20% of students reside in each Tier.

In Washington County,

- 37% students are in Tier 5
- 29% students are in Tier 4
- 23% students are in Tier 3
- 11% students are in Tier 2
- 1% students are in Tier 1

Salem Avenue is located in a Tier 5 neighborhood which borders Tier 3, 4, and 5 neighborhoods.







Achievement by Economically Disadvantaged Status


Salem Avenue outperformed the state average for Economically Disadvantaged students.






Achievement by Race/Ethnicity



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
Achievement over Time

Note: No state assessments were administered in 2019-2020 due to the COVID-19 pandemic.




Grade 3-5 Math Proficiency




Comparison Schools (1 of 2)

Salem Avenue outperformed all 27 schools with similar percentages of Economically Disadvantaged students in ELA and all but one school in Math.



Funding

Salem Avenue's local and state per pupil funding was 3% lower than the LEA median and 17% lower than schools with similar percentages of economically disadvantaged students.

Salem Avenue Elementary	\$11,973
