



Profile of Lakeland Elementary/Middle School (Pre-K to 8) in Baltimore City

Prior to the pandemic, Lakeland doubled their ELA proficiency and tripled their math proficiency.








Achievement by Economically Disadvantaged


In 2019, Lakeland outperformed Maryland's proficiency trend in ELA and math in grades 3-5.





Lakeland Enrollment Over Time (1 of 2)


Lakeland's enrollment nearly doubled from 2011 to 2020. In comparison, Baltimore City's enrollment declined by more than 7,000 students over this period.





Lakeland Enrollment Over Time (2 of 2)


Lakeland's English learner student population has increased three-fold since 2016.





Lakeland Enrollment by Grade


Lakeland enrolled between 78 and 116 students in grade Pre-K through 8.






Lakeland Enrollment by Student Demographics

Nearly half of Lakeland's students are economically disadvantaged*, 95% of students are Black/African-American or Hispanic/Latino, and over half of students are English learners.

Using ACS measures, each block group was given a socioeconomic score and ranked lowest to highest.

Census block groups were assigned to one of five tiers based on the socioeconomic score, with a similar number of school-age residents in each Tier.


Students within each Neighborhood Tier

86% of students in Baltimore City live in Tier 4 or 5 neighborhoods.

Statewide, ~20% of students reside in each Tier.

In Baltimore City,

- 66% students are in Tier 5
- 20% students are in Tier 4
- 7% students are in Tier 3
- 5% students are in Tier 2
- 2% students are in Tier 1



Maryland Neighborhood Tiers: Baltimore City


Lakeland is located in a Tier 5 neighborhood which borders Tier 2, 3, and 5 neighborhoods.

Almost all of Lakeland students come from high poverty Tier 5 neighborhoods.






Achievement over Time

Lakeland increased ELA and Math proficiency significantly leading up to the pandemic. Post-pandemic rates have improved but are not yet at pre-pandemic levels.





Lakeland performed significantly below the state average in the most recent Kindergarten Readiness and MCAP ELA and Math assessments.









Achievement by Economically Disadvantaged Status

Lakeland performed similarly to the state average for Economically Disadvantaged students.







Lakeland performed at or below the state average for Black/African-American and Hispanic/Latino students in ELA and Math.



Accountability Performance

Prior to the pandemic, Lakeland was a 4-star school, but was a 2-star school in 2022.




The percentile rank shows how the school's performance compares to other Maryland schools. For example, an elementary school with a percentile rank of 65 means that the school performed as well or better than 65% of all other Maryland elementary schools, and 35% of elementary schools performed better than this school.




Comparison Schools (1 of 3)

Schools with 40-44% Economically Disadvantaged Students









Funding

Lakeland's local and state per pupil funding was 18% lower than the LEA median and 15% lower than schools with similar percentages of economically disadvantaged students.




