SUBJECT: Legislative Update

Purpose

The purpose of this item is for the Maryland State Department of Education's (MSDE) Office of Government Affairs to provide a legislative update to the State Board of Education. This month, the Department will summarize the outcomes of the 2025 legislative session and highlight key education bills that passed both chambers of the Maryland General Assembly.

Background

In total, the Department tracked 333 bills this year, and 70 of those bills passed both chambers.

- 2,605 bills introduced across the House and Senate
- 333 bills tracked by the Department and the State Board
- 213 fiscal note requests received from the Department of Legislative Services (DLS)

Bill Outcomes by MSDE & SBOE Position

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HB0504: Excellence in Maryland Public Schools Act

- Expands the teacher workforce:
 - Grow Your Own (GYO) grant program
 - Teacher recruitment campaign
 - Out-of-state teacher relocation bonuses
- Strengthens community school implementation:
 - County-wide strategic implementation plans
 - Expanded flexibility for use of funding
 - Program evaluation





HB0504: Excellence in Maryland Public Schools Act

- Extends the Career Counseling for Middle and High School Students Program through FY28
- Establishes programs without FY26 funding
 - Academic Excellence Program (\$17M requested, \$0 appropriated)
 - Blueprint Leadership Training (\$4.5M requested, \$3M appropriated)
- Pauses the requirement to adhere to teaching vs. non-teaching time ratios ("collaborative time")
- Maintains or sustains funding levels
 - Inflationary increase in the foundation per-pupil amount for FY26 (\$162/student)
 - No pause or freeze in community schools funding

SB0252 / HB0150: Child Care Centers - Certificated Staff Ratio Requirement - Repeal (Departmental Bill)

- •MSDE sets the ratio (as opposed to repealing ratio) for child-to-CPR certificate holder for childcare centers
- •MSDE / SBOE Next Steps: Update regulations based on MSDE's determination of the appropriate ratio



HB0161: County
Boards of
EducationCurriculum Guides
and Courses of
StudyDiscrepancies

- •County boards establish curriculum guides and courses aligned with MSDE health guidelines
- •System in place for State Superintendent to hold county boards accountable if their curricula and courses do not align with MSDE guidelines
- •The standards and resources MSDE establishes will include (for each grade) model lessons, syllabi, curriculum units, model student work, etc.
- •MSDE / SBOE Next Steps: Begin work on model resources to support LEAs



HB0672: School Health and Wellness Personnel Assessment and **Maryland Council** on Advancement of School-Based **Health Centers**

- •MSDE and the Department of Health annually conduct an assessment of school health and wellness personnel which includes (by jurisdiction):
 - oRatio of student-to-health professionals
 - oVacancy rates
 - oFeedback on strategies to improve recruitment and retention of school health professionals
- •Report due on December 1 of each year beginning in 2027
- •MSDE / SBOE Next Steps: Coordinate with DOH and update annual data collections



HB0324 / SB0293: **County Boards of Education -Antibias Training** for Members -Requirement (County Board **Member Antibias Training Act)**

- •LEA board members must complete the antibias training once during their term
 - oThis can be the same training employees receive, but the training must be conducted separately
- MSDE / SBOE Next Steps: Communicate with LEAs that the training is a requirement for board members in addition to staff



HB0197 / SB0068: Public Schools Restorative Practices Schools Comprehensive Plan

- MSDE will develop a comprehensive plan for the establishment of restorative practice schools
- •The plan will include a framework on providing training and a model training; establish standards for designation as a Restorative Practice School; and establish performance metrics
- •MSDE / SBOE Next Steps: Develop plan by July 1, 2026



HB1473: State Government -**Equal Access to Public Services for** Individuals With **Limited English Proficiency and** Individuals With Disabilities

•Each State department develops a language access plan focused on providing equal access to public services for individuals with limited English proficiency.

oLanguage access plans must be updated every two years.

- Create and implement language access plan by July 1, 2028
- •Department arranges for translation of vital documents for a language spoken by any limited English proficiency population of 3% or more of the relevant geographic area.
- •Agencies must submit an annual report to the advisory group summarizing activities for language access.
- •State Superintendent or designee sits on an advisory group on language access.
- •MSDE / SBOE Next Steps: Designate MSDE representative for advisory group



HB0071: Education

- Holocaust
Education
Assistance Grant
Program Established

- MSDE manages a \$50K grant
- LEAs apply to MSDE for grant funding to support teacher training or materials on the Holocaust
- MSDE / SBOE Next Steps: Establish grant management process



HB0879: Task Force to Improve Attendance and Reduce Chronic Absenteeism in Schools

- MSDE establishes a task force on chronic absenteeism
- MSDE / SBOE Next Steps: Update regulations on attendance by December 1, 2025; by June 30, 2026, MSDE publishes chronic absenteeism toolkit
- MSDE / SBOE Next Steps: Add public school student and a school-based health professional to task force; update attendance regulations on or before December 31, 2025



HB1475: Maryland **State Department** of Education -**Publicly Funded** Prekindergarten -**Analysis and** Report (Mixed **Delivery Model** Viability Act)

- MSDE convenes a workgroup (with specified members) to conduct an analysis of the mixed delivery model for publicly funded prekindergarten
- The report analysis will focus on discrepancies in policies regulating private/ public providers, private provider reimbursement, the invoicing process, the process for changing Maryland EXCELS levels, language access, facilities challenges, etc.
- MSDE / SBOE Next Steps: Final report due December 31, 2027



HB0477: Family Child Care Homes and Child Care Centers - Adult to Child Ratios Alterations

- MSDE conducts an analysis of the State's regulatory requirement for childcare facilities
- MSDE must study frameworks and governing regulations in other states and evaluate whether they result in higher levels of safety, quality, and operating
- MSDE / SBOE Next Steps: Final report due September 1, 2026



HB1121: Child Care Scholarship Program - Youth **Transitioning From** Foster Placement to Successful Adulthood Program -**Establishment**

- MSDE establishes a framework for Youth Transitioning From Foster Placement to Successful Adulthood Program to remove certain barriers for parenting foster youth
- DHS will refer individuals to MSDE for access to the program
- MSDE/ SBOE Next Steps: Update CCATS and implement program by January 1, 2026

Summary

- State Board Legislative Principle: Bolster investments in public education
 - HB0504 teacher workforce programs, inflationary increase in the foundation per-pupil amount
- State Board Legislative Principle: Prioritize fiscal accountability
 - HB0504 pauses the requirement to adhere to teaching vs. non-teaching time ratios ("collaborative time")
 - HB0197 supports the expansion of restorative practices with minimal fiscal impact



Summary

- State Board Legislative Principle: Equity-focused leadership
 - HB0504 policies strengthening the implementation of community schools for students in high-poverty schools
 - o HB1121 supports youth transitioning from foster placements and their children
 - HB1473 language access plan focused on providing equal access to public services for individuals with limited English proficiency
 - HB0879 supports work on chronic absenteeism to address barriers to consistent attendance that result in achievement gaps
 - SB0451 allows Marylanders to choose to take all components of the GED in Spanish
 - SB0431 strengthens apprenticeship opportunities for Marylanders and advances Blueprint goals
